2 SAMUEL 11:24-25 <sup>ESV</sup>

Then the archers shot at your servants from the wall. Some of the king's servants are dead, and your **servant Uriah the Hittite is dead** also.” <sup>25</sup> David said to the messenger, “Thus shall you say to Joab, ‘**Do not let this matter displease you**, for the sword devours now one and now another. Strengthen your attack against the city and overthrow it.’ And encourage him.”

2 SAMUEL 11:26-27 <sup>ESV</sup>

When the wife of Uriah heard that Uriah her husband was dead, she lamented over her husband. <sup>27</sup> And when the mourning was over, David sent and brought her to his house, and **she became his wife** and bore him a son. **But the thing that David had done displeased the LORD.**
