


CHRIST'S WORK IN THE SAINTS AT CORINTH

- Will be kept firm and blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ (v. 8)




GOD'S CALLING FOR THE SAINTS AT CORINTH

Jesus Christ our Lord.






GOD'S CALLING FOR THE SAINTS AT CORINTH


DIVISIONS AMONG THE SAINTS AT CORINTH


1 Corinthians 1:10 ^{NIV}

In all things, love.






SCHISMS TEARING APART THE SAINTS AT CORINTH

1 Corinthians 1:11-12 ^{NIV}



TRANSCEND THE POLITICAL NARRATIVES

Genesis 1:26a ^{NIV}

Then God said, “Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule...”

Jeremiah 29:7 ^{NIV}

“Also, seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the LORD for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper.”

Matthew 22:19-21 ^{NIV}

“Show me the coin used for paying the tax.” They brought him a denarius,²⁰ and he asked them, “Whose image is this? And whose inscription?”²¹ “Caesar’s,” they replied. Then he said to them, “So give back to Caesar what is Caesar’s, and to God what is God’s.”

TRANSCEND THE POLITICAL NARRATIVES

Romans 13:1 ^{NIV}

Let everyone **be subject to the governing authorities**, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God.

Titus 3:1-2 ^{NIV}

Remind the people to be subject to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready to do whatever is good, ² to **slander no one, to be peaceable and considerate, and always to be gentle toward everyone.**

1 Timothy 2:1-2 ^{NIV}

I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— ² **for kings and all those in authority**, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.




1 Peter 2:1 ^{NIV}

Therefore, rid yourselves of all malice and all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and slander of every kind.

1 Peter 2:12-17 ^{NIV}

Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us.

¹³ Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human authority: whether to the emperor, as the supreme authority, ¹⁴ or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right. ¹⁵ For it is God's will that by doing good you should silence the ignorant talk of foolish people. ¹⁶ Live as free people, but do not use your freedom as a cover-up for evil; live as God's slaves. ¹⁷ Show proper respect to everyone, love the family of believers, fear God, honor the emperor.

Sanctity of Life | Women, children, immigrants, widows, sick, politicians...


Sexuality | Fidelity in marriage between husband and wife

ALL CHRISTIANS ARE UNITED BY CHRIST

1 Corinthians 1:13-17 ^{NIV}

Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Were you baptized in the name of Paul? ¹⁴ I thank God that I did not baptize any of you except Crispus and Gaius, ¹⁵ so no one can say that you were baptized in my name. ¹⁶ (Yes, I also baptized the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I don't remember if I baptized anyone else.) ¹⁷ For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to preach the gospel—not with wisdom and eloquence, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power.
