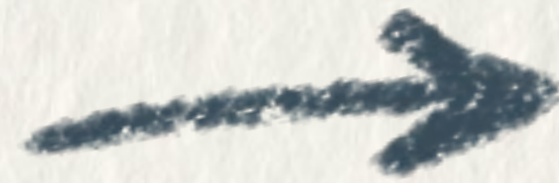


John 19:17-18

and cast lots for my garment.”

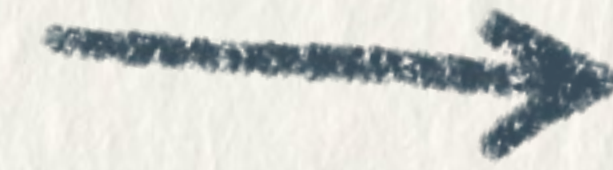
So this is what the soldiers did.

Psalm 22:15


My mouth is dried up like a potsherd,


